STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:



1. Set Up the Workspace

- Lay out old newspapers or a plastic sheet on a flat surface. Have a cup of water ready for rinsing brushes, and put the paper towels nearby for quick cleanup.

2. Put on the Apron

- Ensure your child wears the apron provided to keep their clothes clean.





STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

3. Prepare the Palette

- Pour a small amount of each paint color onto the palette.



4. Choose Tools

- Select brushes, sponges, or textured tools based on the desired effect. Brushes work well for detailed painting, while sponge brushes are perfect for covering larger areas.



STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

5. Use Stamps and Textured Tools

- Dip the stamps into paint and press them onto the paper or canvas. The textured tools can add interesting effects like zig-zags or waves.



6. Experiment

- Allow your child to freely experiment with mixing colors on the palette and using different textures for unique results.



STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

7. Clean-Up

- Wash brushes and sponges with water, and wipe down any messes with paper towels. The paints are washable, so cleanup should be easy.





TIPS FOR BEST RESULTS:

- **Mix Colors on the Palette:** Show kids how to blend colors for new shades.
- **Layer Textures:** Use stamps and textured tools on top of painted areas for depth and interest.
- **Use Different Amounts of Water:** Experiment with a slightly wet brush versus a dry brush for varied paint effects.
- **Work in Layers:** Let one layer dry before adding another on top to prevent smearing.
- **Embrace Imperfections:** Finger painting is about exploration; encourage your child to try new things!
