



The Incraftables Knitting Crochet Kit is a comprehensive kit designed for beginners and advanced crafters alike. This set comes with 21 crochet hooks, 15 colorful yarn spools (totaling 1500 yards), and various tools to support a range of crochet projects. It's organized neatly in a convenient tote bag and includes additional tools to help with precision and accuracy, making it easy to take your crochet on the go or keep everything neatly stored at home.



## WHAT'S INCLUDED:

- Crochet Hooks: 21 pieces in assorted sizes
- Yarn Spools: 15 spools (each approx. 100 yards, totaling 1500 yards) in various colors
- Tote Bag: 1 sturdy, portable bag for storage and organization
- Organizer: 1 compartmentalized organizer for small tools and accessories
- Sewing Needles: 6 pieces, various sizes
- Tape Measure: 1 flexible, retractable measuring tape
- Needle Point Protectors: 4 pieces to protect needle tips and prevent snags
- Stitch Holders: 10 pieces for temporarily holding stitches
- Row Counters: 2 pieces to help keep track of rows in complex patterns
- Thimble: 1 piece, protects fingers while working with yarn
- Safety Pins: 10 pieces to secure loose ends or mark rows
- Scissors: 1 pair for cutting yarn and threads



## STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:



### 1. Set Up

 Unpack the tote bag and use the organizer to arrange your accessories (stitch holders, needles, etc.) for easy access.

## 2. Selecting Yarn and Hook

 Choose a yarn color and matching hook size for your project. Refer to your pattern's hook size recommendation if you have one.





# STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

#### 3. Basic Stitches

Chain Stitch (ch): Start
with a slip knot, then pull
the yarn through to form a
chain. This is often the
starting point of many
crochet projects.



- Single Crochet (sc): Insert the hook into the chain, yarn over, pull through, then yarn over again and pull through both loops on the hook.
- Double Crochet (dc): Yarn over, insert the hook into the stitch, yarn over, pull through, yarn over again, and pull through two loops twice.



## STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

### 4. Using Stitch Holders

 Place stitch holders on stitches that need to be left open temporarily.





## 5. Counting Rows

 Use the row counters to mark each row, especially for larger or more intricate patterns.



## TIPS FOR BEST RESULTS:

- Match Hook and Yarn: Select the appropriate hook size for the yarn weight for even stitches.
- Organize Accessories: Use the organizer to keep track of smaller accessories and prevent them from getting misplaced.
- Use Point Protectors: Protect the tips of your hooks to extend their lifespan.
- Start Small: Beginners may want to start with smaller projects, like scarves or coasters, to build confidence and learn basic stitches.
- Practice Tension: Consistent tension is key to neat, even stitches. Practice holding your yarn for better control.
- Mark Your Work: Use stitch holders or safety pins to mark the beginning of a round or critical points in your work.
- Take Breaks: Crochet can strain your hands; take regular breaks to avoid fatigue.
