STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:



1. Select a Knife

 Choose the knife size that fits your desired texture and paint application technique.

2. Load Paint

 Dip the blade in paint, picking up a generous amount for thicker applications or just a small amount for finer details.





STEP-BY-STEP INSTRUCTIONS:

3. Apply Paint

 Use the edge, flat surface, or tip of the knife to spread, blend, or layer paint on your canvas.





4. Clean Knives

 Wipe off excess paint with a cloth or paper towel between colors to keep your colors clean.



TIPS FOR BEST RESULTS:

- Experiment with Pressure: Apply varying levels of pressure for different effects. Light pressure creates thin, delicate layers, while heavier pressure allows for thicker textures and bold strokes.
- Angle the Knife: Changing the angle of the knife can add dimension to your strokes. Holding the knife flat spreads the paint thinly, while using the edge creates fine lines and details.
- Layer for Texture: For a more dynamic look, allow one layer to dry slightly before adding another. This technique can create a raised, textured effect and add depth to your painting.
- Use Different Knife Shapes: Each knife shape can achieve a different result—use rounded tips for softer lines and pointed edges for precision. Flat edges are ideal for wide sweeps of color.
- Mix Colors on Canvas: Instead of mixing colors on a palette, try blending them directly on the canvas with your knife. This can create interesting color transitions and spontaneous effects.
- Keep a Cloth Handy: Wipe your knife after each stroke to keep colors vibrant and prevent them from muddying.
- Scraping for Effects: To create highlights or correct mistakes, use the knife to gently scrape off excess paint once it's semi-dry. This adds an extra level of control to your artwork.
