TOOLS NEEDED:

- Scissors (for cutting thread and wire)
- Jewelry pliers (for working with clasps and jump rings)

1. Designing Your Creation

- Plan Your Design: Decide on the type of jewelry you want to create (bracelet, necklace, or earrings) and sketch a simple design.
- Color Combination: Choose a combination of pearl beads from the available colors.



2. Creating a Beaded Bracelet with Elastic Thread

- Measure Your Wrist: Determine the length of elastic thread needed (usually around 2 inches longer than your wrist size).
- Cut the Elastic Thread: Use scissors to cut the elastic thread to the measured length.
- String the Beads: Begin stringing the beads onto the elastic thread in your desired pattern.
- Secure the Ends: Once you've added all the beads, tie
 the ends of the elastic thread in a secure knot (double
 knot recommended). You can add a drop of clear nail
 polish or glue to secure the knot if desired.
- Attach a Clasp: If you want a removable clasp, thread the ends of the elastic through the clasp and tie a knot to secure it.





3. Making Designs with Silver Wire

- Cut the Wire: Cut a piece of silver wire to your desired length, leaving extra for looping.
- String the Beads: Slide the beads onto the wire in your chosen pattern.
- Creating Loops: Use round-nose pliers to bend the wire at the ends to create loops, securing the beads in place.
- Adding Jump Rings: If desired, use jump rings to attach components or add additional beads.
- Secure with Clasps: Attach clasps to the ends by looping the wire through and twisting to secure.







4. Connecting Components with Jump Rings

- Use Jump Rings: Open a jump ring using pliers, slide it through the desired components, and then close it securely.
- Creating Dangles: You can create dangles or charm effects by attaching beads to jump rings.



TIPS FOR BEST RESULTS:

- Color Coordination: Play with different colors and sizes of beads to find combinations that appeal to you.
- Knotting Technique: When knotting elastic thread, ensure the knot is tight and that the beads can slide without loosening the knot.
- Wire Work Practice: If you're new to using wire, practice making loops and curls on scrap pieces before working on your actual design.
- Design Stability: If your design is heavy or intricate, consider using crimp beads along with wire for added stability.
- Storage: Keep your beads organized in containers or trays to easily access and sort colors as you work.
