Basic Slime Recipe

Ingredients:

- White school glue (4 oz)
- Baking soda (1/2 tsp)
- Contact lens solution (1 tbsp)
- Water (1/4 cup)
- Food coloring (optional)
- Slime add-ins from the kit

Instructions:

1. Mix Glue and Water:

In a bowl, combine 4 oz of white school glue and 1/4 cup of water. Stir until well mixed.



Basic Slime Recipe

2. Add Baking Soda: Mix in 1/2 tsp of baking soda until fully dissolved.



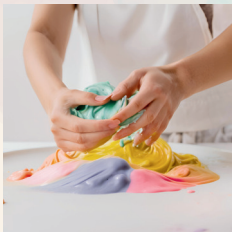
3. Color Your Slime: If desired, add a few drops of food coloring.

4. Activate the Slime: Add 1 tbsp of contact lens solution. Stir well until the slime begins to form and pulls away from the sides of the bowl.



Basic Slime Recipe

5. Knead the Slime: Use your hands to knead the slime until it reaches the desired consistency.



6. Add Decorations: Mix in foam balls, fishbowl beads, candy glitter, shells, pottery tablets, gold foil, and candy slime charms.





Multiple Uses

The slime accessories can also be used for:

- DIY crafts
- Arts and scrapbooking
- Resin jewelry and keychains
- Pendant charms, necklaces, and pendants
- Decorating phone and laptop cases
- Making earrings, bracelets, and coasters
