# INSTRUCTION MANUAL FOR WOOL ROVING KIT

## Introduction to Needle Felting

Needle felting is a fun and creative fiber art involving matting together wool fibers using a special barbed needle. This manual will guide you through the basic materials, techniques, and safety tips needed to start needle felting.

## Kit Contents

Your needle felting kit includes:

- 15 colors of wool roving (5g each)
- Foam mat
- 3 brooches
- Needle holder
- 6ml glue
- 5 needles
- 10 metal rings
- 2 keychain rings
- 10 T-metal pieces
- 10 metal pieces
- 5 lanyards
- 10 plastic eyes
- 5 hoses





# BASIC FELTING PROCESS

- 1. Prepare the Wool:** Thin out the wool by gently pulling it apart.



- 2. Set Up:** Place the wool on the foam mat.



3. **Felting:** Carefully poke the needle through the wool into the foam mat. Repeat until the wool fibers are matted.



4. **Flip and Repeat:** Remove the wool from the mat, flip it, and felt the other side.



**5. Shape and Finish:**  
Add more wool layers and continue felting until the desired thickness and firmness are achieved.
